## FROM THE RECTOR

Dear Friends,

When I arrived at Trinity on March 1, 2012, I had no idea how long my tenure would be. I certainly did not expect it to last 12 years! We have experienced the continuing work of the Spirit during this time. I have had the pleasure to work with the Vestry and lay leaders to live out our baptismal promises of inclusion, love, and justice. The entire congregation came together to remain faithful during the pandemic. In the years since, Trinity continues to grow in numbers

and faith thanks to all of you.

As I know from my ten years as an interim minister, when a rector leaves a parish, everyone — parish members, the staff, the rector — live with a cocktail of mixed, and conflicting, feelings: grief and hope, relief and anxiety about what comes next. The Vestry has started to work with the Bishop and Canon Amy to chart a faithful and effective path to call the next settled rector when the time is appropriate.

reflect on three questions: What has gone well; where did we encounter challenges; where do I need to make amends? Our time together will culminate with a celebratory weekend on Saturday, May 25, and Sunday, May 26.

# Mozart's 'Sparrow Mass' will delight Choir, orchestra to perform at Pentecost Sunday worship

Join us for worship on Pentecost Sunday, May 19, at 10 a.m. as the Trinity Choir sings Mozart's *Missa Brevis* in C, K. 220, "Sparrow Mass." Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart (1756-1795) wrote 19 masses. This mass was written in Salzburg for Archbishop Colloredo in 1776, when Mozart was twenty. The four Mozart masses the Trinity Choir has sung since 2019 were all written between the ages of eighteen and twenty. All are of the *brevis* (short) type, with modest orchestral scorings and brief durations. This one is scored for strings (without violas), trumpets, timpani, and organ continuo and takes its nickname from the violin part in the Sanctus. The music of the Kyrie returns at the end of the Agnus Dei.

All four masses the Trinity Choir has sung are for solo quartet and choir. We are blessed with talented soloists in the Trinity Choir. Jack K. Cox will sing the tenor solos in the quartet. Our paid section leaders will join him—soprano Kaylan Hernandez and bass Cole Stephenson. Replacing Elise Hyder, who will be out of town, is mezzo-soprano Dr. Quinn Ankrum, Professor of Voice at the College-Conservatory of Music. Contracting the orchestra is violinist Manami White, Associ-

ate Director of Collegium Cincinnati and concertmaster of the Kentucky Symphony and Collegium Cincinnati.

If you have heard Cincinnati Vocal Arts or Collegium Cincinnati with orchestra, you will have heard many of the musicians who will perform at Trinity. We are fortunate that our choir has the opportunity to be accompanied by such fine musicians.

## Midday Musical Menu

The final luncheon concert of this season on Wednesday, May 15, features music for tenor and lute. Tenor Jack K. Cox sings Elizabethan lute songs composed by Thomas Campion (1567-1620) and John Dowland (1563-1626) accompanied by William Willits on guitar and lute. Mr. Willits will also play some solo lute pieces.

Jack K. Cox has been singing tenor with the Trinity Choir since 2015. He grew up in Houston, TX, where he served as choir accompanist and section leader at several different churches during his high school years. He earned his Bachelor of Music in Church Music at St Olaf College in Northfield, MN, where he sang with several ensembles, including the St. Olaf

Choir. He earned his Master of Music in Church Music at the Conservatory of Music at Shenandoah University in Winchester, VA, where he sang with the Conservatory Choir. Since coming to Northern Kentucky, he has sung with the Northern Kentucky Community Chorus, the Cincinnati Camerata, Ascension and Holy Trinity Episcopal Church in Wyoming, OH, and Mother of God Church in Covington.

William Willits earned a bachelor's degree in guitar from Grand Valley State University, followed by master's degrees in classical guitar performance and music history from the University of Cincinnati's College-Conservatory of Music. He currently performs on instruments such as classical guitar, Renaissance lute,

baroque guitar, vihuela, Renaissance guitar, theorbo, ukulele, and bass guitar as a solo artist and in chamber settings. Bill has collaborated with Richard Arnest on the Midday Musical Menu series, most recently in November 2020 when concerts were only live streamed. The free concert begins at 12:15 p.m. Lunch is available for \$7 beginning at 11:30 a.m.

## Quilt recalls those who died during Covid

During the worship service on Sunday, April 7, this beautiful quilt was dedicated to Trinity. The following, from the plaque that will hang with the quilt, tells the whole story. This quilt commemorates people in Trinity Episcopal Church who died during the Covid pandemic from January 2020 to June 2021. None of these people died from



Covid. Sue Goodwin and Jackie Braden used 24 Covid masks to create the flowers and 24 masks for the border. The angel's motifs represent Heaven, Infinity, and the Bright White Light of Eternity. The doves represent the Holy Spirit which is with us in this life and the next. Black represents death and yellow is joy and reassurance of life after death; grieving the loss of loved ones. The backing is yellow to represent hope and we printed our purpose on the black strip on the back.

# Episcopalians name Presiding Bishop nominees

The Episcopal Church's next presiding bishop will be chosen this June from a slate of five nominees. The bishops will be presented for election at the 81st General Convention, which convenes June 23-28 in Louisville, Kentucky. On June 26, the bishops will elect, and the House of Deputies, consisting of laity and clergy, will be asked to confirm, the church's 28th presiding bishop, who will succeed Presiding Bishop Michael Curry beginning Nov. 1.

The five are:

- Bishop J. Scott Barker, 60, has led the Omaha-based Diocese of Nebraska since 2011.
- Bishop Daniel G.P. Gutiérrez, 59, has led the Philadelphia-based Diocese of Pennsylvania since 2016.
- Bishop Sean Rowe, 49, has

led the Erie-based Diocese of Northwestern Pennsylvania since 2007.

He also serves as parliamentarian

of the House of Bishops and Executive Council.

- Bishop Robert Wright, 60, has led the Diocese of Atlanta since 2012. Since 2020, he also has hosted the popular podcast "For People" on faith and life.
- Bishop DeeDee Duncan-Probe, 61, has led the Syracuse-based Diocese of Central New York since 2016. She is the only candidate who was nominated through a petition process. The other four were nominated by a national committee.

Curry was elected in 2015 as the church's first Black presiding bishop. Before him, Presiding Bishop Katharine Jefferts Schori, elected in 2006, was the church's first female presiding bishop. Her predecessor, Presiding Bishop Frank Griswold, was the first to serve a nine-year term, after the church shortened the presiding bishop's term from 12 years.

There are few canonical requirements for candidates. They cannot yet have reached the church's retirement age of 72.

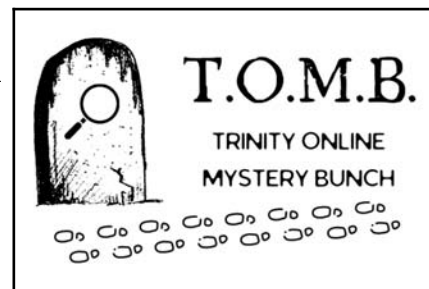
